 - Resource mobilization for the process

□ Impacts, vulnerabilities and risks (short-, medium- and long term)

- ❖ Framework for national adaptation to guide assessment of vulnerabilities and risks
 - Conceptual framework of vulnerability and risk at various levels: national, system level, local level, etc.
 - Boundary conditions for the assessment
 - Focus on key systems/sectors
 - Synergy with SDGs, Sendai Framework for DRR, and other relevant regional and national frameworks
- ❖ Baseline climate based on 1981-2010
- ❖ Current impacts, vulnerabilities and risks
- ❖ Projected future impacts, vulnerabilities and risks

National adaptation priorities

(To address the key impacts, vulnerabilities and risks covering the economy, environment and the social including gender, covering all adaptation needs including those being addressed already – the national adaptation portfolio/the national adaptation effort)



- ❑ **Climate change adaptation implementation strategy including costs**
 - ❖ National climate change adaptation programme: umbrella programme
 - ❖ **Projects and programmes to address key risks for the country**
 - ❖ Essential cross-cutting projects/programmes
 - Creating an effective adaptation process and system (mainstreaming/integration, policies, governance, etc.)
 - Climate information services and early warnings systems, systematic observations
 - Active monitoring of key systems: crop production, water resources, ecosystems, etc
 - M&E system – individual projects and in aggregate for the country
 - Capacity development for implementation of adaptation and support to the process including data and information management, etc
 - ❖ Mobilization of resources
 - Aligned with the GCF country programme,
 - Other relevant climate finance mechanisms (international and domestic) and implementing partners
 - Technology
 - Capacity-building

□ Reporting, monitoring and evaluation framework

- ❖ Monitoring and evaluation system (mapped to goals and objectives, and targets where applicable; 5 types of metrics: inputs, process, output, outcome, impact)
- ❖ Reporting on progress on NAPs under the UNFCCC (through national communications/Adaptation Communications)
- ❖ Link to the NDC
- ❖ Reporting and outreach at the national level

□ Further development of an effective NAP process and updates to the NAP

- ❖ Data and system observations to support future assessments
- ❖ Roadmap (plan) for review and update of the NAP in five years
- ❖ Addressing gaps and needs
