

## NAP GSP SOUTH-SOUTH KNOWLEDGE EXCHANGE FORUM

### 28 June – 1 July 2021

The National Adaptation Plan Global Support Programme (NAP-GSP) is jointly implemented by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP), funded by the Global Environment Facility (GEF) through the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF). Under the NAP-GSP, the NAP-GSP South-South Knowledge Exchange Forum is being organised online from 28th June – 1st July 2021.

This Forum aims to facilitate an exchange of the learnings, lessons learnt, existing and untapped opportunities, by the LDCs in addressing their medium- and long-term adaptation needs through the process to formulate and implement National Adaptation Plans (NAPs). This would help countries make greater strides in their NAP process in the near future, especially in formulating, implementing and financing their NAPs. The Forum also aims to specifically inform current formulation of NAPs by facilitating a global exchange, highlighting emerging best practices and presenting experiences with the existing tools that policymakers, technical experts and government officials have been using.

The detailed structure of the 4-day Forum is outlined as below. Please note that all timing mentioned are Bangkok time. For the ease of reference for participants, a table is attached at **Annex- I** showing corresponding country local time.

## DAY 1 – 28<sup>th</sup> JUNE 2021 (MONDAY)

Discussions on Day 1 would focus on 2 topics related to the countries’ national mandate and strategy for the NAP process and the developments of NAP roadmap and NAP formulation.

### TOPIC 1: Formulation of mandate and institutional coordination mechanism for NAP process

By now, all the LDCs have initiated or launched the NAP process at the national level through an appropriate mandate and the mobilization of relevant institutional arrangements and support. In countries where work relevant to the NAP process is already under way and appropriate mandates exist, this step would enhance those efforts and proceed to producing a road map for steps that would still need to be undertaken.

- Key questions / issues on which countries can share and exchange their experiences and lessons:**
- i. How have countries built a vision for the NAP process and how have they defined the objectives?
  - ii. What type(s) of institutional coordination mechanism helped in the process / that seemed to work best?

### TOPIC 2: Development of NAP roadmap and NAP

The development of the NAP roadmap involves various key components. It includes conducting briefings to policymakers about climate change adaptation challenges and opportunities, including sequencing of various NAPs and a monitoring and evaluation plan for the NAP process. It also defines a NAP framework and strategy and create or enhance a national vision and mandate for the NAP process.

- Key questions / issues on which countries can share and exchange their experiences and lessons:**
- i. How are your NAP being developed? Strategies, roadmap, and stakeholders involved.
  - ii. Experiences in using the NAP has a strategic instrument to integrate adaptation in development planning and budget processes; prepare adaptation investment portfolios; and develop the adaptation component of the NDC

## DAY 2 – 29th JUNE 2021 (TUESDAY)

Discussions on Day 2 would focus on 2 topics related to climate data and risk assessment capacities of the countries and aspects of integrating adaptation into national and subnational development planning and budgeting.

### TOPIC 3: Climate science and vulnerability and risk assessments to guide decision-making in adaptation

Analysing current climate risks and evaluating how these determine current vulnerability to climate change has been a critical to almost all the LDCs. This analysis extends to identify future climate risks through the application of climate change scenarios. The results of this broad climate risk analysis helps to identify adaptation needs to be addressed. Countries would also like to present their experiences with the economic appraisal of adaptation strategies. This would help to identify and choose on the various alternative solutions once the problem is identified. Discussions on monitoring and adaptation metrics can also be considered.

#### **Key questions / issues on which countries can share and exchange their experiences and lessons:**

- i. Lessons learnt and opportunities in analysing current and future climate scenarios
- ii. Experiences in assessing vulnerability to climate change at various levels and in assessing risks

### TOPIC 4: Integrating adaptation into national and subnational development planning and budgeting

Integrating climate change adaptation into national and subnational development calls for an understanding of the planning and budgeting cycles to identify entry points. Integration is the second global objective of the NAP process.

Discussions on Day 3 would focus on 2 topics related to the development of Implementation strategies and cross-cutting issues such as inclusive approaches and gender considerations

### TOPIC 5: Developing Implementation strategies

Prioritization of adaptation helps select the most important and feasible adaptation measures to be implemented given competing development needs. It can then lead to the development of a clear long-term implementation strategy that provide guidance on how to implement the adaptation priorities, including timing, target areas/ beneficiaries, responsible authorities, resource mobilization and sequencing of activities. The strategy will need to be focused, have a clear sense of direction and be linked to the national vision for adaptation and development priorities, plans and programmes.

#### Key questions / issues on which countries can share and exchange their experiences and lessons:

- i. How have adaptation priorities been prioritized? What criteria were used?
- ii. Have implementation strategy been developed? What have they included (e.g. information on timing, barriers and way to overcome them, target areas/beneficiaries, responsible authorities and sequencing of activities)?
- iii. How countries have built on and complemented existing adaptation activities?

### TOPIC 6: Adopting inclusive approaches and fostering indigenous and community led approaches to NAPs including gender considerations.

A gender-sensitive approach and addressing the adaptation needs of the most vulnerable groups and communities are critical to the success of the NAP process.

#### Key questions / issues on which countries can share and exchange their experiences and lessons:

- i. How is the gender dimension and social equity concerns included or being included in the NAPs in your country?
- ii. How are vulnerable communities' concerns taken into consideration in the NAP process?
- iii. What have been the challenges and lessons learned in responding to the needs of different vulnerable groups and communities' and responding to them in the NAPs?
